

A note from the Administrator- Tayna

The Angel Courtyard brick and gate repairs are completed and once again the enclosed courtyard is accessible to our Grandfriends and visitors to enjoy some fresh air safely. Next, the repairs are moving inside the building with a significant HVAC improvement. The front entrance and mall area of the nursing home continues to have problems with heat and humidity during the summer months. The beautiful skylights in the mall are partially to blame, but the 30-year-old air handler that controls the air conditioning in the mall area, business offices, activity room, and resident dining room is more to blame. Because of the age of the equipment, a replacement strategy instead of repair is recommended along with some improvements to control the temperature in different zones instead of just one zone for the entire area.

During hot and humid days, the resident dining room heats up and is quite warm during the evening meal. A mechanical & electrical engineering firm has been hired and a bid for replacement of the air handler with improvements has been accepted. The first phase will likely start in August with mechanical work in the resident main dining room, which will put our main dining room out of service for at least a week or possibly longer. Our plans for the process are not complete, but residents will need to temporarily eat in the small dining room (Sleepy Eye room), Nutrition site, Living room, or their rooms during this time.

While the dining room is out of commission, we thought it would be a good time to replace the mall area tile that continues to lift up and loosen. As an alternate flooring to the loud and bumpy tile, a polyurea floor coating has been approved. The tile and vinyl flooring in the front entrance, mall area, Chapel corridor, and service hallway will be removed and the floor prepped for a ¼ inch full chip floor system installation. Before deciding on this type of flooring, we visited another local business and a residential home. Both installed this system a few years ago and are happy with the results. The carpeted areas in the mall will be replaced with new carpet. During this project, our front entrance might be closed for a day or so, but we will post updated information on the front doors to keep everyone informed.

Another project starting this fall won't be as disruptive to services but could be noisy. Due to moisture in the crawl space some steel columns that support the building are deteriorating. Most are located under the nursing home and chapel. An engineer recommends adding Smartjacks to the deteriorating steel columns to reinforce and stabilize the building. We have accepted the bid for this repair and hope to start the project in September.

Sorry for all the inconvenience during our improvements, but remember, visitors are always welcome, and we don't want to hinder anyone from stopping in.
