A note from the Administrator- Tayna

This past year, I promised to share information about the different departments that are needed to make Divine Providence a home. My focus this month is on Nursing which is the largest department. Currently we have about 40 staff that are either Registered Nurses (RN), Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN), Trained Medication Aides (TMA), Certified Nursing Assistants (CNA) or nursing assistants in training. Agency staff is utilized to fill in the gaps and prevent burn-out. The leader of this department is the Director of Nursing (DON), Shelly Augustin.

Nursing is the only department that is staffed 24/7. We are required to have at least 8 hours of RN coverage a day. Except for some weekends, we typically have around 40 hours of RN coverage a day. An RN is always on call if we do not have one in the building and a licensed nurse either RN or LPN is always working.

While some tasks such as assessments, admissions/discharges, passing meds, dressing changes, and treatments can only be performed by an RN, LPN, or TMA the entire department works as a team and often shares tasks if it is within their scope of practice. Typically, the CNAs help the most with personal hygiene duties such as brushing teeth, bathing, hair styling, makeup, shaving, and dressing. Bathroom needs, meal time assistance, and exercise such as walking are also carried out, but of course everyone pitches in when needed.

Caregivers are always monitoring and watching for any resident changes that need to be reported to the charge nurse for further follow-up. Helping the resident every day, caregivers immediately notice even small changes in their residents. Nurses will report these changes to the family and coordinate care with their physician if needed. Keeping residents safe is a priority. Sometimes one on one is provided to prevent falls or elopement.

One thing abundant in this department is walking. Nursing staff are on their feet and moving most of the day. If you are familiar with our building, then you understand all the walking it takes to get residents to and from the dining room or delivering meals to residents that choose to eat in their room. Daily mass also requires a wheelchair push or walking assistance to the chapel which is located on the other end of the building. Thankfully, volunteers, often Lake Villa Maria tenants, help with chapel transporting. Documenting in computer charts all the care that has been provided and any resident changes is as important as providing the care and does provide an opportunity to get off their feet.

Nursing is so much more than answering call lights. Most caregivers already know which menu item their resident will choose before a meal. The bond that develops between the caregivers and the resident is like a family. Spending so much time together, nursing learns the resident's history and understands their life before they needed nursing home care. This learning goes both ways with the resident getting to know the caregiver too. It is a wonderful opportunity for both resident and caregiver to support each other socially and emotionally. Thanks to our entire Nursing Department for sharing their love and caregiving skills with our Grandfriends and each other.


