With the April showers, the green grass has been vibrantly growing in the neighborhood as the ladies have been regularly watering their lawns and even mowing the grass already (pictured above)!






Students from St. Mary's Honor Roll Society stopped by for a visit and enjoyed a game of Bingo with the residents.



Getting to know Sr. Emily

Sr. Emily has been serving at Divine Providence since 2022 as a CNA. This is her first obedience since professing her vows and becoming a Daughter of St. Mary of Providence.

Where were you raised? I was raised in North Oxford, Massachusetts.



When and how did you know you wanted to become a Sister? After my freshmen year of high school, I attended my first Steubenville Conference and had an awakening of my faith life. The following year I went back and attended a week long pre-retreat called Franciscan LEAD. While I was there, I met a girl who was planning on entering another community of Sisters after college. Meeting her inspired an interest in my heart to look deeper into this way of life that I had never really considered. I started looking at different communities of Sisters. A show I watched on Lifetime TV featured different communities and the second one featured was the Daughters of St. Mary of Providence. Seeing their love in particular for those with developmental disabilities and their joyful demeanor attracted me at a deep level. Eventually I decided to call them and scheduled a visit in Lake Zurich, IL. After the visit, I didn't think I would be returning. It didn't seem like the right fit at the time. However, one of the sisters personally called me and invited me back. That meant a lot to me, so I returned and fell in love on that visit.

What was the process to become a Sister? After graduating high school, I entered the community as an Aspirant on August 15th, 2016 at Mount St. Joseph, Lake Zurich IL. Aspirancy is the first step in getting to know your way around, the schedule, and learning to pray with the Sisters. A few months later, on December 12th, I became a Postulant with the community. During this time, I went deeper into the faith and learning what religious life is all about. On February 9th, 2020, I became a Novice with 3 other women from other countries. As a Novice, I learned about the spirituality of our community through classes and study of our Founder. On August 15th, 2022, I professed my vows as a Daughter of St. Mary of Providence and became Sister Emily. I received the habit and was told I would be coming to Sleepy Eye.

What have you enjoyed most about being a sister? I have enjoyed spending time with my Sisters and taking care of the residents whom I consider family too.

What has been the biggest challenge? Balancing time spent in community and in prayer with the Sisters, as well as being present to our residents.

What do you hope to fulfill as a Daughter of St. Mary of Providence? My hope is to become a happy, holy Sister and to share that joy with others.
