

A note from the Administrator- Jayna

The Minnesota Nursing Home Resident Quality of Life Survey is an annual survey conducted by the Department of Human Services (DHS) to collect feedback from nursing home residents on their personal experiences and opinions. This survey gathers data to help improve the quality of care and services in nursing facilities across Minnesota. The survey measures residents' subjective well-being, which is distinct from clinical quality of care and includes aspects like environment, engagement, and personal needs. It provides a platform for residents to voice their opinions on their daily experiences, such as their food options, staffing interactions, and access to activities. The data collected is used to identify areas for improvement and guide policies and initiatives aimed at enhancing care. The survey is conducted by an independent firm, Vital Research, to ensure the confidentiality and anonymity of resident responses.

Our survey has not been scheduled yet, but before the end of the year, surveyors will come to our home and with resident or guardian consent conduct in-person interviews to gather resident feedback on various aspects of their life in the facility. Resident responses are coded to calculate a facility's score, providing a standardized way to measure performance. The state also uses the data for public reporting, such as on the MN Nursing Home Report Card.

Family members/representatives will also have the option to participate, but not in-person. The Family Satisfaction survey is mailed to the primary responsible party for each long-stay resident and can also be completed online or by phone. Just this month, we received the results from last year's survey conducted in early January of this year. The eight key areas include meaningful activity, food enjoyment, environmental adaptations, dignity, autonomy, relationships, caregiving, and mood. Not a surprise to us, but a big kudos to our staff, we exceeded the Minnesota state average in all eight areas. And in seven areas, we improved our results from the previous year. In fact, in the dignity measurement we have a perfect score, 100%. That is amazing! At the same time, we celebrate this awesome accomplishment, we are using the result to see what we can do even better.

To do so well on this satisfaction survey, means all departments are working in collaboration. Our staff is building personal relationships with our residents and making genuine connections that make our Grandfriends feel seen and valued. We are respecting their dignity and privacy, providing encouragement and independence to each unique individual. Our team can be proud of the compassionate care they provide which is the key to our success.

October was the month of the Rosary, Kindergarteners from St. Mary's came by to make rosaries out of Play-doh with the residents.


